Mission Aviation Fellowship began in 1945 as the Christian Airmen's Missionary Fellowship (CAMF) with military pilots who wanted to use the skills that they had learned during World War II for God's glory.

Betty Greene flew the inaugural missionary flight to Mexico on February 23, 1946.







They flew into Ecuador in South America with a missionary named Jim Elliot and changed an entire people group and nation with their willingness to sacrifice themselves for Christ's cause.

MAF began setting up a short-wave radio network in 1952 so that missionaries in faraway places could radio their families back in the United States.







Mission Aviation Fellowship flies missionaries, medicine and mail into places that are far from roads and cities. Places where other people can not go!











MAF developed landing strips in Indonesia and throughout Africa so that every person could be reached with the Good News of Jesus Christ.
